West Point Lake Hunting Permits

Mobile, Ala.- The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, West Point Project announced hunting permits for the 2008-2009 season are now available for purchase. The permits are required, in addition to state hunting licenses, to hunt on lands managed by the Corps. Each permit consists of a card listing the permit holder's name and address, as well as special regulations that apply in addition to state game laws. A map depicting the lands available for hunting and listing weapons restrictions, along with a data sheet to report game harvested, is also included.

The fee for the permit is \$15, which covers the administrative costs associated with the program. "The hunting map was revised for the 2007-2008 season, and there have been no alterations for this season," said E. Patrick Robbins, Public Affairs Officer, Mobile District. Last year's hunting map, therefore, is still valid. "There are approximately 6,000 acres of hunting lands available in Georgia and 2,000 in Alabama," said Robbins. West Point Lake Hunting Permits do not apply to the West Point Wildlife Management Area, consisting of more than 10,000 acres which are managed by the Georgia Department of Natural Resources.
